RECIPE – Gingerbread

450g/1lb plain flour
1 tbsp baking powder
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
1 tbsp ground ginger
175g/6 oz butter

175g/6 oz soft dark brown sugar
175g/6 oz black treacle
175g/6 oz golden syrup
1 egg beaten
300ml/10 fl oz milk

Preheat oven to 160C/325F/Gas 3. Grease and line 23cm/9" square cake tin.

Sift together dry ingredients in large mixing bowl. Melt together butter, sugar, treacle and syrup, until sugar has dissolved. Allow to cool slightly.

Mix egg with milk and add cooled butter mixture. Add all the liquid ingredients to the flour mixture and beat well with wooden spoon until smooth and glossy.

Spoon batter into prepared tin and bake in centre of pre heated oven for approx 90 minutes until well risen and firm to the touch.

Allow to cool in the cake tin and remove when cold.

- 1 Exhibit must be grown or owned by the exhibitor and not previously shown
- 2 Doors will open for exhibits on Friday 4th August 2016 6.30 – 8.30pm and Saturday 5th August 8.30 – 10.30 am.
- 3 All exhibits must be staged by 10.30 on the day of the show.
- 4 The judges decision will be final
- 5 Points to count - 1st x 3 points, 2nd x 2 points, 3rd x 1 point.
- 6 No exhibit or be removed before 5.30pm.
- 7 Exhibitors may enter more than one exhibit in any one class.
- 8 The Garden Show Committee reserve the right to view any produce grown and shown by the exhibitor.
- 9 The Garden Show Committee will not accept responsibility for any loss, accidents or damage to exhibits.
- 10 No late entries accepted.
- 11 All entry forms to be in by 7.30pm on Friday 4th August 2016.
- 12 A charge of 20p per item entered is payable to cover show costs.
- 13 All children's entries under age of 16 are free of charge.
- 14 In the childrens categories ages up to 10 years will be junior, and age 11-16 years will be senior
